2 Dec - Advent Sunday marks the first Sunday in the church's year. It also marks a very important time of preparation, for the coming of the Messiah. For countless generations, the people of God longed for the coming of a saviour, while they tried their best to serve God in their own

generation and context. We will journey through the Advent season with those people, and try to get a sense for ourselves how different life was before the arrival of Jesus Christ.

9 Dec - To long for something in the future, may mean breaking with something from the past. Each of us has a story, of how we got where we are now. Each of us has an invitiation to be part of God's story. Prophecy is often considered 'an Old Testament thing'. But it still has real power today, and God still inspires leadership, to bring our world towards his kingdom.

Thoughts For December

16 Dec - In the work of John the Baptist, he prepared people for the coming of Jesus. We hear how 'the people were filled with expectation'. We are constantly reassured that 'the Lord is near', and that in our own lives and experiences, we are guarded by the peace of Christ.

23 Dec - We know from the writer in Ecclesiastes that 'there is a time for everything', including a time to mourn. Christmas and its preparation is an emotionally charged season, and a time of great busyness, hustle and bustle. It can be hard to escape the relentless pressure to be joyful during 'the most wonderful time of the year'. However, for many of us, this season is a difficult one, in which a sense of loss can be more acute. This morning, we reflect on the Advent hope and longing, in a Blue Christmas service.

This evening is the traditional service of lessons and carols, in which the drama of the Christmas story unfolds before us.

24 Dec - The beautiful First Eucharist of Christmas is celebrated at midnight, as the time of expectation ends, and the incarnation becomes real.

25 Dec - Always a fun filled service, as we gather to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, and the impact that still has today.

30 Dec - A joint service in Nuns Cross Church, as we gather as a united community to celebrate the ongoing glory of the Christmas season.

Advent Services






Choir




Ovoca Camp

Direct Provision at the Grand Hotel

It was recently announced that the Grand Hotel will become a centre for Direct Provision, accommodating up to 100 people in emergency accommodation. Very little is known about the people who will come to Wicklow through Direct Provision, but we have an opportunity and an obligation to welcome newcomers: "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Matthew 25:35. On 26 November, some of Wicklow's clergy, along with the founders of a new group, 'Wicklow Welcomes', met with the owner, and the general manager of the Grand Hotel, to talk about how our community can help those who will come to Wicklow through Direct Provision.

Wicklow Welcomes is a large and diverse group, with people from many different backgrounds, but we share a belief that kindness and compassion cost us nothing, while benefitting everyone.

The aim of the meeting was to talk to the hotel management to get a better idea about how we might be able to help. We want our support to come via a 'ground up' approach - i.e., to listen to

the stories of the people themselves, and identify areas of need. So, we are not in a position to call to the community for anything specific just yet, but we are so delighted that so many have offered us their support, which we know we can call on when it is needed.

Our main interest is to assist those who might seek our help, who are disorientated & who are vulnerable, who find themselves in Ireland, in our town. We consider ourselves global citizens, with a responsibility to respond to the needs of humanity, regardless of nationality. We are not getting involved in the politics of Direct Provision, or the rights and wrongs of commercial decisions. Our appeal to the community of Wicklow is: let us contribute positively to public discourse, regarding the plight of refugees and asylum seekers. Unfortunately, this is an imperfect world, and there are so many situations of need. However, we as a community have an opportunity to bring some comfort and hope to one situation of need, and an opportunity to challenge negativity and suspicion, with love.

General Announcements PRAYERS

We are really keen to involve more people in worship in Wicklow Parish. One way to do this is to involve people in leading the prayers of intercession at services. Would you be willing to help with this, on an occasional basis? If so, please speak to Jack. There is an information pack available, with pointers on how to lead a congregation in prayer.

PARISH FINANCES

As each parish in the Church of Ireland is financially self-sustaining, we can only function financially through the good will of our parishioners. Any parishioners, who have not yet entered a planned contribution scheme, please speak to Philip Hastie (parish recorder) or John Clarke (hon. treasurer -0874127386). If you have parish envelopes, cash or cheques placed on the collection plate can be recorded. Alternatively, there are standing order forms available in church. If a taxpayer donates €250 or more per year (and we can trace the donations through the envelope scheme or standing order) we can claim a further 45% of the amount through the government's charity tax relief scheme. The details of any person's contributions are kept completely confidential. This income is used to maintain the ministry of a full time Rector, to maintain the beautiful church building, and to provide resources for parish activities, such as Sunday Club, Messy Church and youth clubs, as well as church services. Please consider the parish as part of your financial plan.
