Thoughts For February

2 Feb -Today, we commemorate the presentation of Christ in the Temple – when his parents brought him to the Temple for the first time, to ask for God's blessing, and commit his life to God. This day is often called 'Candlemas' in Christian churches. This refers to a tradition of blessing candles for use throughout the year.

Symbolically, we are reminded that our faith is rooted in the incarnation - that God has drawn alongside us, and lived with us. May we pray that the light of our faith will burn throughout this year. 9 Feb - The concept of 'good news' is central to this morning's readings. People can be motivated by either fear, law, or love, as a means of governing their behaviour. Fear does not lead to any sense of satisfaction in life; law alone is dispassionate and can be manipulated. However, love is the motivation of God, and so love as a motivation for us brings about the greatest sense of satisfaction. 16 Feb - There is a phrase often used to describe someone under pressure - they seem to have the weight of the world on their shoulders. We can so easily get so caught up in the responsibilities and stresses of our daily lives, that we only look downwards, and never up. When we do this, our perspective is constantly narrowing, not broadening. Today, we are reminded of the importance of setting life in its context - which is ultimately the context of God's creation. Maybe our prayers could include the line: This is a bit much for me, God - I'll let you take it from here.

23 Feb - The Transfiguration is a miracle which is unique in an even more particular way – it happens to Jesus himself. This mystical and mysterious experience alludes to the fact that God is indeed far beyond human understanding, and yet affords humanity a glimpse of divine magnitude and glory. Significantly, the voice from heaven indicates that God's disciples should look first to Jesus.
