Thoughts For February

3 Feb - As we mark the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, we think about worship in the modern world. How do we maintain practices which point us to God, without them becoming stale or repetitive? And how do we engage in a way which is fresh and new, without our

understanding of God becoming diluted and self serving? The answer lies in today's second reading...

10 Feb - The common theme of today's readings, concerns the ability of humanity to fall short of perfection, and yet still be regarded by God. We call to mind the aspects of our life that we most want to improve, while also rejoicing that God accepts and loves us, just as we are.

17 Feb - With rights and privileges come responsibilities. To accept God's love means to accept God's truth. The call of Jesus is to join his mission of the transformation of the world. We are not called to endure unnecessary hardship, but are to be prepared that the road ahead isn't always easy.

24 Feb - The Lord does not despise anything within the creation he has put in motion. As we make value judgements in the society we help form, it is vital we bear this in mind.

Training for Lay people as Diocesan Pastoral Assistants

The purpose of this training programme is to equip a range of people to visit primarily in homes, whether those they visit be longestablished residents or recent arrivals. There is an immediate urgency for such work not least because of a significant number of upcoming housing and residential developments but also because of loneliness and alienation in suburban and rural life in today's Ireland. The training course will be delivered by Church Army (Ireland) through Archdeacon Isaac Hanna and his team. While having theological and intellectual credibility, the course is not designed to be academic but

practical and engaging for all concerned. The course will be delivered in three full-day sessions on Saturday 9th February, Saturday 9th March and Saturday 13th April 2019. The course will lead to the commissioning before the summer as Diocesan Pastoral Assistants of those who complete it through the awarding of the Bishops' Certificate. Candidates will need the endorsement of their rector or Rural Dean, as appropriate. They will also need to be Garda Vetted before beginning work.

PARISH FINANCES

As each parish in the Church of Ireland is financially self-sustaining, we can only function financially through the good will of our parishioners. Any parishioners, who have not yet entered a planned contribution scheme, please speak to Philip Hastie (parish recorder) or John Clarke (hon. treasurer -0874127386). If you have parish envelopes, cash or cheques placed on the collection plate can be recorded. Alternatively, there are standing order forms available in church. If a taxpayer donates €250 or more per year (and we can trace the donations through the envelope scheme or standing order) we can claim a further 45% of the amount through the government's charity tax relief scheme. The details of any person's contributions are kept completely confidential. This income is used to maintain the ministry of a full time Rector, to maintain the beautiful church building, and to provide resources for parish activities, such as Sunday Club, Messy Church and youth clubs, as well as church services. Please consider the parish as part of your financial plan.
