Thoughts For March

3 March - In the Transfiguration, we see how an encounter with God can bring about total transformation. To follow the Way of Jesus is to enter into the work of God, which is all about transformation, salvation, and grace. If we seek out God, we might be amazed at what becomes possible

10 March - In today's readings, we are reminded that all that we have is by God's goodness, and without God we would have nothing. However, the context of this lesson is gratitude. As we begin the journey of Lent, we also consider the topic of temptation.

17 March - On St Patrick's Day, we think about our Patron Saint, whom we are told was brought to this land against his will, yet felt drawn back here after escaping. We think about the presence of God, even when any of us encounters the 'dark night of the soul.' **24 March** - Humanity is very good at feeling sorry for itself. We can all indulge in complaining and feeling hard done by. Today, we are challenged to think about the steps we might take ourselves to improve our cause. The invitation of God is to an abundant life, not self imposed bitterness.

31 March -The experiences we have in life form us to be the people we are. We must learn to be reconciled with what has happened in the past, for we are assured of God's presence and love, no matter how and where we might stray. Today is a 5th Sunday, so we look forward to welcoming parishioners from Nuns Cross, as we join in worship as a joint parish at the 10am service.

HELP WANTED!



General Announcements PRAYERS

We are really keen to involve more people in worship in Wicklow Parish. One way to do this is to involve people in leading the prayers of intercession at services. PARISH FINANCES

As each parish in the Church of Ireland is financially self-sustaining, we can only function financially through the good will of our parishioners. Any parishioners, who have not yet entered a planned contribution scheme, please speak to Philip Hastie (parish recorder) or John Clarke (hon. treasurer -0874127386). If you have parish envelopes, cash or cheques placed on the collection plate can be recorded. Alternatively, there are standing order forms available in church. If a taxpayer donates €250 or more per year (and we can trace the donations through the envelope scheme or standing order) we can claim a further 45% of the amount through the government's charity tax relief scheme. The details of any person's contributions are kept completely confidential. This income is used to maintain the ministry of a full time Rector, to maintain the beautiful church building, and to provide resources for parish activities, such as Sunday Club, Messy Church and youth clubs, as well as church services. Please consider the parish as part of your financial plan.
